Arrest In Security Guard's M

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, May 16, 2013:

An arrest is yet to be made in the most recent murder of an on-duty security guard even after the recovery of the guard's stolen license firearm and the detention of two suspects.

San Ignacio police reports that at about 7:45 pm on Friday, May 10, 2013, information was received via the emergency 911 line of a shooting incident at Kenny's Store located on Flamingo Avenue in San Ignacio Town.

A team of officers were quickly dispatched to the scene where they were told that the injured guard was rushed to the San Ignacio

Community Hospital.

On arrival at the hospital, the guard identified as Randy Casey, 23, of Camalote Village, Cayo District was pronounced dead with two gunshot wounds to the left side of the chest and a third on the lower left side of the abdomen.

It is reported that Casey, an employee of Force Security Company was on duty at Kenny's store when a lone, masked gunman dressed in dark clothing approached the guard and fired three shots at him. The injured guard fell to the ground. With the guard laying on the ground face upwards and gasping for air, the gunman allegedly leaned over him and took possession of the gun he carried. The assailant then ran to a waiting car which sped off.

Swift police action and investigation resulted, one day later, in the recovery of the suspected murder weapon as well as the point 22 pistol stolen from the guard. Notwithstanding the major development in the case, an arrest is yet to be made in this latest murder in the twin towns.

A sixteen year old minor and a resident of Santa Elena were detained pending investigations but have since been released. Whilst seeking assistance from the general public, San Ignacio police informs that the matter continues under investigation. Randy Casey was laid to rest today in his home village of Camalote on Thurdasy, May 16, 2013.

Something Does Not Seem Right In The **Pinelo Arrest**

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Friday, May 17, 2013:

Primary school teacher Eddie Pinelo has been in jail for a week on allegations that he sodomized a 14 year old student.

Pinelo has since been remanded to prison while his family has enlisted the services of an attorney to secure his release by way of a Supreme Court

In a statement to the police the boy alleges that sometime in April of this year, the teacher invited him to his house in Bullet Tree village where it is alleged that he was offered and consumed alcoholic beverages to the extent of getting drunk. The boy said that all he recalled was being lifted by the accused and taken off to a bedroom where he was allegedly sodomized by the teacher.

Guatemalan Sent To Jail For Five Years

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, Wednesday, May 15, 2013:

A Guatemalan, apprehended in the Chiquibul National Park, has been sentenced to spend the next five years behind bars after pleading guilty to keeping firearm and ammunition without a gun license.

It was shortly after 6:00 pm on Tuesday, May 14, 2013, when a joint forces team of law enforcement personnel on patrol in the Chiquibul National Park came upon two Hispanic male persons walking suspiciously in the area. The police ordered them to halt but they instead ran off.

The police caught up with one of them who had a gun slung over the left shoulder. On inspection the gun was found to be a point 22 rifle without serial number and brand. Police also found seven live point 22

New Developments In Overnight And Cruise Sectors

Belize City, Belize - May 13,

There is fantastic news to report in the Tourism travel industry. Hot on the heels of the release of record breaking tourist arrivals in the first quarter of 2013, new flights and cruise calls to Belize were announced for the final quarter of the year.

Starting in November, Delta Airlines will be adding another Saturday flight from Atlanta to Belize. Delta currently deploys seven flights a week (one flight per day) to Belize, increasing its total number of flights to eight per week (twice on Saturdays). This is an additional 596 seats per month, and will be a permanent addition to Delta's schedule to Belize. In addition, American Airlines will be increasing its Dallas to Belize flights from three

It shows amazing growth and more opportunities for the industry and Belize."

As the Ministry of Tourism & Culture and the Belize Tourism Board continue to invest efforts to increase cruise arrivals for Belize, the Royal Caribbean International announced weekly flights to seven flights per that not only have they renovated their

'Navigator of the Seas' to include unique features such as a Flow Rider Surf Simulator and the First-Ever Virtual Balcony, but will also deploy the Navigator of the Seas year round out of Galveston, Texas, starting in Winter 2013. As a result, Belize will receive a total of thirty cruise calls during 2014. For the past two years, Belize has not had more than 10 calls per year from 'Navigator of the Seas'; therefore this news will result in a 200% increase for this cruise ship. It is expected that this increase in cruise calls will bring over ninety thousand cruise visitors to Belize.

The City Prepares For 2013 Hurricane Season While Cayo Slumbers

The 2013 Hurricane Season is almost upon us. The Belize City Council is busy preparing the city's emergency evacuation route; there will be 70 evacuation route signs installed along the emergency route as well as hosting Disaster Preparedness Training for the City's Operation Management and Shelter Management Team.

We commend the City for these actions and it points out the obvious lack of concern for those of us living downstream of BECOL's dams.

Does BECOL and the other relevant bodies responsible for the safety of people downstream of the dams have any plans in place? Has

there been any meetings, simulations, communications with the villagers, townspeople and all those along the Macal, Mopan and Belize Rivers?

We recently spoke to villagers in the area and they said the last time there had been any information about disaster preparedness was two or more years ago – about the last time BELPO took the Department of Environment, NEMO and BECOL to court.

Maybe they are waiting for a disaster to happen before action is taken. If so, it may be too late for too many.

Let us remember that when a hurricane warning comes and people

must evacuate the coast, many come to Cayo. They may be putting themselves in more danger than if they stayed put - out of the frying pan into the fire.

BELPO is calling on the Department of Environment (DOE), the National Emergency Management Organization (NEMO) and The Belize Electric Company Limited (BECOL) to implement the Dam Break Emergency Plan they are required to do under the Environmental Compliance Plan and two court orders.

This is no longer a country ruled by the rule of law. It has become a country where the big money rules. It is up to us, the people, to see that no one is above the law, according to

the rule of law.



Benque Viejo Community Policing Unit

The RC school in Succotz Village, has seen its share of criminal activity this week, (1) a victim of a burglary & theft, (2) finding drugs on campus.

Because of these recent events the principle Mr. Viviany Teul, and teachers decided to invite the community policing unit of the Benque Viejo Sub-Formation to school for a basic education on community policing, neighborhood watch, youth cadets, Special Constables, Great program, and other relevant topics of the day.

The community policing officer PC Mckoy, had planned to give the presentation, however a previous commitment for special training by the US Embassy prevented him, so Special Constable Mr. Samuel Bruce was called in to assist on Thursday 9-5-13.

The students met in the classroom of one the schools most experienced teachers, and a vital member of the Zone 4 Neighborhood Watch Program in Benque Viejo, class teacher Mrs. Isela Tesucum.

In Mr. Bruce's presentation he explained to the students the basic concepts of all the programs of the community policing efforts, and stressed the importance of being observant of your surroundings and noting details of suspicious activities



such as; strange persons & vehicles in their village, how to note descriptions of people & vehicles, especially license plate numbers.

Mr. Bruce and Mrs. Tesucum demonstrated to the children how they can help their parents at home, the importance of creating a book of inventory of their property with proper descriptions with brand, serial & model numbers such as; TV, computers, phones, stereo's, tools, etc...This is vital to help police have the proper information to legally Identify their property if ever stolen.

Mr. Bruce as Captain of the Neighborhood Watch in Benque printed calendars that were handed out to the students to take home which has all the important emergency numbers, along with police pamphlets on domestic violence, and Home Protection.

Special Constable Bruce concluded with the promise to come back with PC McKoy for a presentation on Gangs, Drugs, and Criminal codes that effect their future.

Mother's Day Gift; Mr. Bruce was so impressed with the school's eagerness to learn about the community policing programs and willingness to get evolved in their community to help fight crime. A jeweler by profession Mr. Bruce returned the next day, and donated a pair of gold earrings for the schools Mother's Day program.



Pope Francis hits out at global 'cult of money'

Pope Francis has called on world leaders to end the "cult of money" and to do more for the poor, in his first major speech on the financial crisis.

Free market economics had created a tyranny, in which people were valued only by their ability to consume, the pontiff told diplomats in the Vatican.

"Money has to serve, not to rule," he said, urging ethical financial reforms.

Meanwhile, the Vatican's own bank announced it would publish its annual report for the first time.

The Institute for Works of Religion, which has been at the centre of various financial scandals in recent

years, is to hire an external accountancy firm to ensure it meets interna-

tional standards against money laundering.

The bank would launch a website and publish its annual report in an effort to increase transparency, new president Ernst Freyberg said.

The institute is considered one of the world's most secretive banks.

'Golden calf'

Pope Francis said life had become worse for people in both rich and poor countries, the BBC's David Willey in Rome reports.

In a biblical reference, the pontiff said the "worship of the golden calf" of old had found a new and heartless image in the current cult of money.

He added that reforms were urgently needed as poverty was becoming more and more evident.

People struggled to live, and frequently in an undignified way, under the dictatorship of an economy which lacked any real human goal, Pope Francis said.

He made his remarks during an address to newly accredited ambassadors to the Holy See.

The new pontiff, who took over from Benedict XVI in March, is renowned for his efforts of tackling poverty in his native Argentina.

He has previously said that the Church has a special duty to defend the poor.

"I would like a Church that is poor and is for the poor," he said following his election as head of the world's 1.2 billion Catholics two months ago.

The pontiff said he had chosen the name Francis in a direct reference to St Francis of Assisi, the Italian founder of the Franciscan Order who was devoted to the poor.

Ten Reasons Why Buggery Should Not Be Decriminalised

The Caribbean Centre for Family and Human Rights (CARIFAM) recognizes the fundamental and intrinsic dignity of all people whatever their orientation. We recognize that for reasons not yet fully explained by science, persons may experience attraction to members of their own sex. Overcoming these attractions can be a very painful challenge requiring the support, understanding and compassion of others. For this reason we distinguish between those who have a homosexual tendency and those who promote homosexuality. Our opposition to legalizing buggery (homosexual acts) is not an opposition to gay people but a recognition that marriage as between one man and one woman is for the common good – in the best interests of society. Our reasoning is as follows:-

1. Decriminalising buggery means legalizing homosexuality. This opens the door for the legalization of, every conceivable form of sexual perversion as a "sexual orientation" or "alternative lifestyle".

The very argument used by gay activists to justify legal recognition of their "sexual orientation" and "alternative lifestyle" is the very same legal argument which can be used to justify legalization of at least

twenty one other sexual perversions including, bestiality voyeurism, and necrophilia. The North American Man Boy Love Association for example lobbies to ban age of consent laws thus legalizing sexual relations between children and adults (pedophilia).

Consider the obvious harm to society and the danger to children! Prosecution of child sexual abuse will be near impossible!

2. Legalising homosexuality opens the door to for legalization of same sex "marriage" and can also be used to justify legalizing other forms of relationships such as polygamy, incestuous couplings, or any type of "loving relationship". This is wholly undesirable.

Once gay activists succeed in achieving the legalization of homosexuality they quickly demand "rights" to same sex marriage, adoption etc. Fourteen different countries, having begun with the decriminalizing of buggery, now have been coerced into accepting, embracing and legalizing homosexual marriages.

This was not done by referendum but by legislative power, against popular wishes, as per France. Thus marriage has been moved away from nature and biology to emotions and feelings -. If marriage is about feelings then why is adultery wrong?

On being "in love". If marriage is about feelings then why is adultery wrong? Being in love should not be the sole basis for demanding a right to marry, otherwise siblings, as well as parents and children, and other close relations, could also demand the right to marry each other.

Marriage is a natural institution between a man and a woman. It is rooted in human nature, not a social construct – present in every known society – and has been proven to be the best environment for the well being of men, women, and the upbringing of children.

Reproductive sex within marriage has a unique role, beneficial to all of society. The survival of the human species depends on heterosexual marriage.

3. It will undermine the family, the fundamental cell unit of society. Strong, healthy families are essential for strong, healthy societies.

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) Article 16 recognizes the family based on marriage between one man and one woman as "the natural and fundamental group unit of societyentitled to protection by society and the state". This recognition is at the heart of the human rights project as Member States of the United Nations, many decades ago universally recognized that strong, intact families are essential to protection of fundamental human rights. If families breakdown, children, men and women become extremely vulnerable, and societies disintegrate. .

Social Science data repeatedly shows that children raised with their biological parents within marriage, as a general rule excel in every area of well being than to children brought up within other family settings.

The Caribbean, now more than ever, needs strong families. Saint Lucia's rate of out of wedlock (extra marital) births is highest in the world (85.8 percent) as per UN World Fertility Report 2007 p. 70.

It will aggravate the problem of absentee fathers as the bisexual population grows. The problem of absentee fathers has been identified as a key cause for youth underachievement and delinquency. A World Bank Study in the Caribbean in 2003 entitled Caribbean Youth Development - Issues and Policy Directions urged Caribbean governments to make families and fathers a top public policy issue.

4. Same-sex marriage denies the child the basic right to a mother and father.

Both mothers and fathers are needed for a child's healthy growth and development. Their contribution to parenting and child development are unique and distinct. Studies repeatedly show that a child's best interests are served by being brought up by a mother and a father. The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child recognizes this fact by providing in Article 7 (1) that as far as possible every child "has a right to know and be cared for by his or her parents".

Fatherlessness and motherlessness both have serious consequences which governments or government programs can never compensate for. We should not deliberately legislate to place the child at such a serious disadvantage from the onset of his life. 5. Homosexuality has not been proven to be genetic. Evidence suggests that environmental, familial, and personal influences contribute significantly to homosexual tendencies. tendency toward homosexuality need not be acted upon. It can be successfully overcome.

There is no compelling empirical or biological evidence which confirms that homosexual behavior is genetic. Even if it were it should be discouraged because, like a tendency towards alcoholism, which has been proven to be genetic, it is unhealthy (a biological fact), and harms the individual and society.

Additionally, the prevalence of homosexuality is repeatedly grossly

exaggerated both regionally and internationally. The Kinseyan notion that 10% of the population of the United States is gay has been seriously undermined by new studies which have concluded that the actual percentage of male homosexuals in the United States is somewhere between 2-3%. Likewise, the unsubstantiated claim by Dr. Edward Greene United Nations Special Envoy for the Caribbean on HIV/AIDS that in some Caribbean countries 20% of men are gays is grossly exaggerated.

Caribbean Governments should make adequate resources available for the establishment of programmes to assist persons struggling with same sex attractions so that they can overcome them. There are many, many, stories of persons who have successfully overcome unwanted same sex attractions. Best practice models should be carefully studied and adapted to our Caribbean context.

6. Homosexuality is an unhealthy and harmful practice which leads to injury, disease, and early death. According to the US Centers for disease Control, men who have sex with men are 44 to 86 times more likely to be HIV positive than men who do not have sex with men.

Empirical evidence and social science data clearly show that homosexual activity is an unhealthy and harmful practice which leads to injury, disease and early death, and to increased prevalence of sexually transmitted diseases HIV/AIDS, depression, etc. The infection rates among homosexuals with men are increasing on a daily basis. This continuing spread has been termed a syndemic.

The Pan Caribbean Partnership on HIV/AIDS (PANCAP) Strategic Plan 2006-2012 notes that the few studies of men who have sex with men in the Caribbean estimate very high HIV rates from 5 to 33 per cent (%). Decriminalisation of buggery will lead to an increase in the prevalence of HIV/AIDS. Women will be exposed to more diseases from their promiscuous men folk.

7. Engaging is homosexuality or any kind of "alternative sexual lifestyle" is not a human right.

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) recognizes the right of men and woman of full age to marry and found a family. There is no binding universally accepted human rights instrument which recognizes homosexuality or sexual orientation as a human right.

Human rights have never been recognised based on behavior or

preference. In case of "sexual orientation" this amounts to behavior which lacks clear definition and can change on a daily basis.

8. Gay rights activists promote a radical agenda which seeks to undermine fundamental Jude o-Christian principles which have been the bedrock of western civilization.

It is important to distinguish between the actions of the person with a homosexual tendency who genuinely needs help to overcome this unwanted same sex attraction and the gay activist.

The agenda of gay activists is not to seek health and well being but to impose their radical views on all people with total disregard for freedom of religion, freedom of speech, freedom of conscience which are all universally recognized fundamental human rights.

Not all homosexuals are gay activists. There are many homosexuals who do not support gay marriage for all or some of the reasons which have been outlined above. Recent demonstrations against gay marriage in France included groups of homosexuals publicly opposed to gay marriage. One of these persons was well known French Mayor, Jean Marc, (homosexual) who noted that "The rights of children trump the rights to children".

9. The sexual rights agenda imposes acceptance of "alternative lifestyles" on all peoples. It undermines freedom of religion and freedom of conscience. It disregards sovereign rights of states, unfairly coerces smaller developing nations and unjustly links recognition of these "rights" to development aid. This is a new form of cultural imperialism.

Individuals are denied the freedom to express a dissenting view and are labeled as "homophobic" for expressing opinions even if they do so respectfully. Attempts are made to embarrass them publicly and even to deny them employment. Even pastors and priests have faced criminal prosecution for preaching against homosexuality to their congregations in their churches within the context of their religious beliefs.

Gay activists are not a minority group. They are extremely well funded and powerful. Due to their influence, developing countries within the Caribbean are under immense pressure from more developed countries to decriminalize buggery laws or lose development aid. This cultural imperialism is unacceptable. Caribbean countries are sovereign, each democratically elected and accountable to the people of their respective countries within the Caribbean.

10. Legalising buggery will deny the fundamental right of parents to determine the quality of education which their children receive.

Once laws are changed, it is inevitable that school curriculums will be adjusted so as to be in conformity with current legislation.

Even where buggery remains illegal, the right of parents to determine the quality of education their children receive is already being infringed. Recently parents were up in arms in Jamaica because material directly promoting homosexuality was included in the school Health and Family Life Education (HFLE) Curriculum without the knowledge or consent of parents. The Minister of Education, Ronald Thwaites pulled the curriculum out of schools and apologized to angry parents saying "I consider sections of this material inappropriate for any age and certainly for the grade seven and eight for which it is designed." See Jamaica Gleaner September 15, 2012.

In some Western countries, even where parents are homeschooling, they are prohibited from teaching that homosexuality is wrong even if that teaching is based on their religious beliefs. Parents face penalties - even jail terms! In some cases parents are not permitted to opt children of these harmful curriculums or even to home school!

Discrimination is an inevitable part of human activity. Our ability to discriminate helps us make safe and wise decisions. Arbitrary discrimination is always wrong and unjust. CARIFAM opposes all unjust discrimination against

homosexuals. However, we maintain the unique importance of preserving marriage as between one man and one woman. Legally protecting marriage is absolutely necessary for human flourishing, for stable healthy families and societies, and for the continued survival of the human species!

President Chinchilla is said to have used the jet in March to fly to Venezuela for the funeral of the former leader **Hugo Chavez**. She then used the plane again last weekend for a private trip to Peru.

But it has since emerged that both the jet, and its owner **Gabriel Morales Fallon**, were under investigation by Costa Rican intelligence officials for possible ties to drug trafficking.

Mr Morales was "linked to very complicated and complex situations from a criminal point of view", Mr Boraschi said earlier in the week, though he had no

convictions and was not subject to any arrest warrant.

The use of the jet came about after

Mr Morales reportedly introduced himself to Mr Chacon under a false name.


Mr Chacon has admitted he did not fully vet Mr Morales and the aircraft.

Before his resignation was announced, **Mauricio Boraschi**, who was also Costa Rica's anti-drugs commissioner, said his agency had not been told that the president was using the private aircraft.

Colombian authorities have investigated Mr Morales over alleged ties to jailed Brazilian drug trafficker **Luis Carlos Ramirez**. Mr Morales has denied any such links.

President Chinchilla has long been vocal about the need to tackle the drugs threat in the region.

Earlier this month, she discussed the problem of drug cartels with US President Obama during his visit to Costa Rica.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

It has come to the notice of the Elections and Boundaries Department that certain false and unauthorized ballot papers relating to the Village Council Elections are currently being circulated to electors by persons unknown. Any ballot papers not issued by the Elections and Boundaries Department and not initialed by the election clerk/officer are invalid and will be rejected at the time of counting.

All electors are therefore warned to be vigilant in casting their votes so that their ballot papers are not rejected.

Mexico official fired for daughter's 'abuse of power'

Mexican President Enrique Pena Nieto has fired a senior official over an incident caused by his daughter at an exclusive restaurant last month.

Humberto Benitez Trevino's daughter caused outrage by using his influence to try to close down the bistro after it did not give her a table she wanted.

The episode sparked a discussion about abuse of power in the country.

The sacking suggests that Mexico has grown more sensitive to the issue, correspondents say.

The episode became a trending topic on Twitter under the hashtag #ladyprofeco, after her father's agency.

Mt Benitez, the attorney-general for consumer protection, and his daugh-

ter both apologised, but this did little to appease public anger.

On Wednesday, President Pena

Nieto ordered his dismissal.

The restaurant, Maximo Bistro in Mexico City, was raided by officials

after Andrea Benitez was not offered the table she had asked for.

The government said that although Mr Benitez was not personally involved in the raid, the episode had become embarrassing for the institution.

Argentina ex-military leader Jorge Rafael Videla dies

Former Argentine military leader **Jorge Rafael Videla** has died aged 87 while serving a life sentence for crimes against humanity.

He is reported to have died from natural causes in prison.

The general was jailed in 2010 for the deaths of 31 dissidents during the 1976-83 military dictatorship, of which he was overall leader until 1981.

Up to 30,000 people were tortured and killed during this period, in a campaign known as the "Dirty War".

Gen Videla had been sentenced to life in prison for torture, murder and other crimes in 1985, but was pardoned in 1990 under an amnesty given by the president at the time, Carlos Menem.

In April 2010, the Supreme Court upheld a 2007 federal court move to overturn his pardon.

Eight months later he was found "**criminally responsible**" for the torture and deaths of 31 prisoners and

jailed for life.

Most of the left-wing activists were taken from their cells in the central city of Cordoba and shot dead shortly after the military took power.

The army said at the time that they were killed while trying to escape.

Gen Videla was one of 30 members of the security forces charged with the murders.

'A bad man'

Last year, he was also convicted of overseeing the systematic theft of babies from political prisoners.

At least 400 babies are thought to have been taken from their parents while they were held in detention centres.

More than 100 children given for adoption to military or police couples have since been reunited with their biological families.

A court in Buenos Aires sentenced Videla to 50 years in prison, while another ex-military leader, **Reynaldo Bignone**, received 15 years for his alleged role in the crime.

In an interview with an Argentine journalist last year, Videla said the crackdown he oversaw was the price Argentina had to pay in order to remain a republic.

"War, by nature, is cruel," he said. "An internal war, between brothers, is especially cruel."

Jose Miguel Vivanco, director of Latin America for US-based Human Rights Watch, said Videla presided over one of the region's cruellest repressions in modern times.

"He was arrogant to the end and unwilling to acknowledge his responsibility for the massive atrocities committed in Argentina," he said.

"Many of the secrets of the repression will die with him."

Trafficking Gang 'Smuggled Bangladeshis Into Brazil'

Brazilian police say they have identified a gang specialising in trafficking Bangladeshi nationals into the country.

About 80 workers have been lured by their own countrymen with promises of earning up to \$1,500 (£985) a month.

But they ended up as slave labour in order to pay their smugglers nearly \$10,000, police say.

South America's biggest economy has recently seen a steep rise in cases of illegal immigration.

The smugglers explored routes across the borders of Peru, Bolivia and Guyana to enter Brazil, investigators said.

'Coyotes'



Brazil has recently seen a rise in the number of immigrants from Bangladesh, Haiti and Africa

The workers were found living in

slavery-like conditions eight houses in the town of Samambaia near Brasilia, an investigator told the Agencia Brasil news agency.

He said the Bangladeshis worked at freezer warehouses, building and car-washing sites.

A number of smugglers have been identified and investigators were granted 14 search warrants, officers said

Among the smugglers are four alleged "coyotes" - men who managed the actual border crossings.

It is not yet clear what will happen to the smuggled men.

Brazil has recently seen a steep rise in cases of illegal immigration.

Last month the governor of the state of Acre, next to the Peruvian border, declared emergencies in two towns because of the growing number of immigrants from Haiti and African countries.

winner Adolfo Perez Esquivel told Reuters news agency: "Death has brought an end to his physical existence but not what he did against the people."

The head of the Grandmothers of the Plaza de Mayo, an association that works to uncover the real identities of the stolen children, described Videla as a "bad man". "I'm reassured that a discredited man has departed this world," said Estela de Carloto in a statement to local media.

Videla was born in 1925, the son of an army colonel.

In 1976, he and two other military leaders staged a coup against President Isabel Peron, the widow of former leader Juan Domingo Peron.
