Mob Facing obbery Charge

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, Tuesday, September 2, 2014:

San Ignacio police is this week reporting the arrest of a female on a robbery charge.

Kean Reyes, 18, Belizean student of Blackman Eddy village, told the police that at around 8:00 pm on Friday, August 29, he was socializing with at a friend, Israel Gilharry, at a pizzeria on Burns Avenue in San Ignacio, when they were approached by a female known to Gilharry. Reyes informed that at around 8:30 pm they

left the bar and were walking in a dark area on Far West Street when Reyes was reportedly attacked.

Reyes told the police that he was grabbed from behind and placed in a choke hold. With a pair of breasts pressed against his back, Reyes realized that he was being held by a female. The complainant said that he felt a sharp object pressed to his rib cage and the gold chain he was wearing was yanked from around his

After snatching the chain the

robber ran off. Reyes reportedly turned around and saw the fleeing attacker whom he recognized as wearing the same clothes as the female they met earlier at the pizzeria.

Swift police investigation led to the apprehension of Shanira "Mob" Perez and the recovery of the stolen chain. The accused was consequently arrested and charged for robbery.

Swift police work led to the arrest of neighborhood suspects: Akeem Guzman, 18, Belizean laborer of a Carillo Puerto Avenue, Santa Elena address, along with two minors all of whom were issued with a joint burglary charge.

The investigation further led to the recovery of the flat screen TV, the cell phone and the stereo system resulting in the arrest, on a handling stolen good charge, of one Reymundo Vasquez, 28, Belizean laborer of a Mabel Pitts street address.

All four persons appeared in court on Monday, September 1. They pled not guilty to individual charges and were released on bail.

In 1984 a tree was planted. There was a change in Government for the very first time in the history of Belize. The United Democratic Party (UDP) was elected to government. The People's United Party (**PUP**) chain in Government was broken. A mere three years after the attainment of political independence, in 1981, the new UDP government found the nation's finances in shambles. The first task of the new UDP government was to get the nation's finances in order. Unpopular, but necessary, political actions had to be taken. After five years of sacrifice, the nation's economic position was brought back on track.

Just as the tree, planted in 1984, was about to bear fruits it was cut down. The PUP was reelected to government in 1989. Without missing a beat the raping of the rescued finances of the nation resumed. The mismanagement of the nation's finances was such that within three and a half year of its five year term in office, the PUP called general elections, a full 16 months before it was constitutionally due. In calling early elections, the Prime Minister of the day, George Price, declared that "JOB DONE". Knowing that the task of building a nation is never done, Belizeans realized that what Price meant was that "MONEY DONE".

The tree was replanted. The UDP was reelected to office by a landslide majority in 1993. The reelected UDP government, fully aware of what it was getting into, found the national economy in even worse state than it

was when it was first elected to office in 1984. The country's financial position was in a total mess. The nation was on standby arrangements with the International Monetary Fund. The foreign reserves stood at a critical two weeks of import with the statutory requirements being three months. Government was on the verge of being unable to meet the public service payroll. Even harder and much more politically unpopular actions had to be taken to avert the inevitable total economic collapse of the nation. Among the necessary actions that had to be taken was the introduction of a 15% Valued Added Tax (VAT) and a reduction in the size of the public service (*retrenchment*). After five years of taking necessary actions the national economy was coming back to life. The tree was beginning to blossom. VAT and retrenchment however became the hallmark of the PUP campaign leading up to the next general election. George Price was forced to resign in 1996 and Said Musa was elected as the leader of the PUP in opposition.

The blooming tree, on the verge of bearing fruits, was again cut down. The PUP, this time with Said Musa as its leader, was reelected into office in 1998. Nothing changed with the new PUP, the raping of the nation started almost immediately. The nation began spiraling into economic difficulties shortly after the Musa Government was elected to office. Intent on holding on to power however, the bucket sale of Belizean

passports, mostly to Asians, became the order of the day. The sale of Belizean passports was exacerbated with the uncertainty looming over Hong Kong post 1999. The Hong Kong situation was eventually stabilized thereby reducing the demand for an alternative passports.

In urgent need of finances to remain in power, the attention of the PUP government was turned to the sale of the nation's assets. They sugar coated this bitter pill by calling it privatization. The nation's electricity, telecommunications and water companies were sold off. The nation's only airport and only seaport were sold. This injection of quick funds created a false sense of national prosperity. The dalla beer and the caliente dancers ushered the PUP into election victory in 2003.

After the reelection hype, reality stepped in. The nation's financial position was grim. The demand for Belizean passports had drastically diminished except for a few here and there which was mostly used for personal enrichment not being enough to shore up the failing economy. There were no more national assets to privatize/sell. The next available alternative was to resort to borrowing. Thus began the reckless borrowing giving birth to the infamous \$2 billion **SUPERBOND** all of which was used for recurrent expenditure just to keep the government floating with nothing invested in capital expenditure to address the nation's deteriorating infrastructure. The reckless borrowing was unsustainable. The PUP Musa maladministration fell in 2008.

The tree was replanted for a third time. Then entered a new Prime Minister, the **Hon. Dean Barrow**, an imminent attorney, a no-nonsense politician, the man who was to

become the nation's saving grace. The new Prime Minister was intent on not repeating the 1984 and 2003 political errors of his party. His mantra was no new taxes, no retrenchment. Prime Minister Barrow met the nation's finances in TOTAL **SHAMBLES**. The International Monetary Fund came knocking on the doors of the new Dean Barrow Administration. Cut the public service, raise taxes, impose new taxes was the IMF's prescription for economic restoration. Prime Minister Barrow's response to the IMF was "GO FLY A KITE. NOT ON MY PEOPLE".

The new Prime Minister immediately set out to renationalize the nation's assets sold off by the previous administration. First to be renationalized was the telecommunications company in 2009 and the electricity company the following year. The private owners of the water company were not satisfied with the rate of return and, on their own, resorted to returning the company to government control. The Dean Barrow administration ushered in the restoration of Belizean national pride.

The conscience of Belizean voters was awoken. The blossoming tree was saved. It was not cut down. The UDP, for the first time, was reelected in 2012 for a second consecutive term. The Belizean people began to enjoy the fruits of the tree. The nation is undergoing unprecedented development. The building of the nation is taking place in the north, south, east, west and central.

The tree will never again be cut. It grew in the first term, bore fruits in the second term. In a third term, Belize will flourish under the political tree of the United Democratic Party Government. Sub Umbra Floreo.

World Suicide Prevention Day 2014: Suicide Prevention: One World Connected

Suicide is a complex problem which catches the attention of everyone. As a public health problem it requires attention, but its control and prevention is not easy. Research have shown that it will take a whole series of activites to address, from the provision of the best possible condition for bringing up our children and young people, through the effective treatment of mental disorders, to controlling environmental risk factors and effective dissemination of information and awareness. All these factors are key to suicide prevention.

What is suicide? It is a deliberate act of self harm, often done with the aim of summoning help.

Attemt suicide is: A none fatal act of self harm, often done with the aim of summoning help.

Suicide rates are increasing all over the world and it is no different in Belize. In developed countries it is among the top ten leading cause of death in the 15 to 35 years age group. The World Health Organization has

Efforts to prevent suicide have been celebrated on World Suicide Prevention Day - September 10th -Each year since 2003. In 2014, the theme of World Suicide Prevention Day is 'Suicide Prevention: One World Connected.' The theme reflects the fact that connections are important at several levels if we are to combat suicide.

Connectedness is crucial to individuals who may be vulnerable to suicide. Studies shown that social isolation can increase the risk of suicide and, conversely, that having strong human bonds can be protective against it. Reaching out to those who have strong human bonds can be protective against it. Reaching out to those who have become disconnected from others and offering them support and friendship may be a life-saving act.

World Suicide Prevention Day has proved to be bery successful in encouraging organizations to coordinate their efforts and learn from each other. It has also assisted those who have been bereaved by suicide in making themselves heard in discissions about suicide prevention. This has sharpened the focus on

activities that are effective in preventing suicide.

Warning Signs of Suicide

These signs may mean someone is at risk for suicide. Risk is greater if a behavior is new or has increased and if it seems related to a painful event, loss or change.

- * Talking about wanting to die or kill oneself.
- * Looking for a way to kill oneself, such as searching online or buying a
- * Talking about feeling hopeless or having no reason to live.
- * Talking about feeling trapped or in unbearable pain.
- * Talking about being a burden to others.
- * Increasing the use of alcohol or drugs
- *Acting anxious or agitated; behaving recklessly.
- * Sleeping too little or too much.

- * Withdrawn or feeling isolated.
- * Showing rage or talking about seeking revenge.
- * Displaying extreme mood swings. Ways to prevent suicide

Suicide never only affects the person that committed it. It affects everyone and the person too. But many suicidal thoughts can be prevented if the warning signs are recognized and proper action is taken. The steps below are for someone who is already having what is called "Suicidal Ideation". This means that they have already considered actions to harm themselves some way in order to feel something different than what is causing them distress.

3 Steps to Prevent Suicide 1) ASK

If you think someone maigh be suicidal, ask them directly "Are you thinking about suicide?" Don't be afraid to do this, it shows you care and will actually decrease their risk because it shows someone is willing to talk about it. Make sure you ask directly and unambiguously.

2) LISTEN AND STAY WITH

If they say 'yes', they are suicidal, listen to them and allow them to express how they are feeling. Don't leave them alone. Sta with them or get someone else reliable to stay with them.

3) GET HELP.





Leptospirosis

Leptospirosis (also known as field fever,rat catcher's yellows, and pretibial fever among others names) is an infection caused by bacteria of the Leptospira type. Symptoms can range from none to mild such as headaches, muscle pains, and fevers; to severe with bleeding from the lungs or meningitis. If the infection causes the person to turn yellow, have kidney failure and bleeding it is then known as Weil's disease. If it causes lots of bleeding from the lungs it is known as severe pulmonary haemorrhage syndrome.

There are ten different types of Leptospira that cause disease in humans. It is transmitted by both wild and domestic animals. The most common animals that spread the disease are rodents. It is often transmitted by animal urine or water containing animal urine coming into contact with breaks in the skin, the eyes, mouth, nose or vagina. In the developing world the disease most commonly occurs in farmers and poor people who live in cities. In the

developed world it most commonly occurs in those involved in outdoor activities in warm and wet areas of the world. Diagnosis is by growing the bacteria from a blood sample, finding its DNA in the blood, or looking for antibodies against the infection.

Efforts to prevent the disease include protective equipment to prevent contact when working with

potentially infected animals, washing after this contact, and reducing rodents in areas people live and work. The antibiotic doxycycline, when used in an effort to prevent infection among travellers, is of unclear benefit. Vaccines for animals exist for certain type of Leptospira which may decrease the risk of spread to humans. Treatment if infected is with antibiotics such as: doxycycline, penicillin, or ceftriaxone. Weil's disease and severe pulmonary haemorrhage syndrome result in death rates greater than 10% and 50%, respectively, even with treatment.

Signs and Symptoms

Leptospiral infection in humans causes a range of symptoms, and some infected persons may have no symptoms at all. Leptospirosis is a biphasic disease that begins with

flu-like symptoms (fever, chills, myalgias, intense headache). The first phase (mild leptospirosis) resolves, and the patient is briefly asymptomatic until the second phase (severe leptospirosis) begins. 90 percent of cases of the disease are mild leptospirosis and without any specific treatment and the rest develop to severe leptospirosis. This is characterized by liver damage (causing jaundice), renal failure with same signs and symptoms; the heart and brain can be affected, meningitis of the outer layer of the brain, encephalitis of brain tissue with same signs and symptoms; and lung affected as the most serious and lifethreatening of all leptospirosis complications. The infection is often incorrectly diagnosed due to the nonspecific symptoms.

Signs and symptoms of leptospirosis include high fever, severe headache, chills, muscle aches, and vomiting, and may include jaundice, red eyes, abdominal pain, diarrhea, and rash. Initial presentation may resemble pneumonia. The symptoms in humans appear after a 4–14 day incubation period. More severe manifestations include meningitis, extreme fatigue, hearing loss, respiratory distress, azotemia, and renal interstitial tubular necrosis, which results in renal failure and occasionally liver failure (the severe form of this disease is known as Weil's disease, though it is named sometimes Weil Syndrome). Cardiovascular problems are also possible.

Incubation (time of exposure to first symptoms) in animals is anywhere from 2 to 20 days. In dogs, leptospirosis most often damages the liver and kidney. In addition, recent reports describe a pulmonary form of canine leptospirosis associated with severe hemorrhage in the lungs—similar to human pulmonary hemorrhagic syndrome. Vasculitis may occur, causing edema and potentially disseminated intravascular coagulation (DIC). Myocarditis, pericarditis, meningitis, and uveitis are also possible sequelae.

Eye finding may include conjunctival suffusion

Cause

Leptospirosis is caused by a spirochaete bacterium called Leptospira spp. At least five important serotypes exist in the United States and Canada, all of which cause disease in dogs:

- * Icterohaemorrhagiae
- * Canicola
- * Pomona
- * Grippotyphosa
- * Bratislava

Other (more common) lethal infectious strains exist. Genetically different leptospira organisms may be identical serologically and vice versa. Hence, some argue about strain identification. The traditional serologic

system currently seems more useful from a diagnostic and epidemiologic standpoint—but this may change with further development and spread of technologies like polymerase chain reaction (**PCR**).

Leptospirosis is transmitted by the urine of an infected animal, and is contagious as long as the urine is still moist. Rats, mice, and moles are important primary hosts—but a wide range of other mammals including dogs, deer, rabbits, hedgehogs, cows, sheep, raccoons, opossums, skunks, and certain marine mammals carry and transmit the disease as secondary hosts. In Africa, the banded mongoose has been identified as a carrier of the pathogen, likely in addition to other African wildlife hosts. Dogs may lick the urine of an infected animal off the grass or soil, or drink from an infected puddle.

House-bound domestic dogs have contracted leptospirosis, apparently from licking the urine of infected mice in the house. The type of habitats most likely to carry infective bacteria are muddy riverbanks, ditches, gullies, and muddy livestock rearing areas where there is regular passage of wild or farm mammals. The incidence of leptospirosis correlates directly with the amount of rainfall, making it seasonal in temperate climates and year-round in tropical climates. Leptospirosis also transmits via the semen of infected animals.

Humans become infected through contact with water, food, or soil that contains urine from these infected animals. This may happen by swallowing contaminated food or water or through skin contact. The disease is not known to spread between humans, and bacterial dissemination in convalescence is extremely rare in humans. Leptospirosis is common among water-sport enthusiasts in specific areas, as prolonged immersion in water promotes the entry of the bacteria. Surfers and whitewater paddlers are at especially high risk in areas that have been shown to contain the bacteria, and can contract the disease by swallowing contaminated water, splashing contaminated water into their eyes or nose, or exposing open wounds to infected water.
