BELIZEAN FACING IMPRISONMENT FOR INCIDENT IN NEIGHBOURING MELCHOR

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, Thursday, February 4, 2016:

Kayla Sanchez, a 25 year-old Belizean, remains detained in Peten, Guatemala, and she is awaiting a criminal hearing before a judge from that country.

Shew being accused of going into Melchor De Menchos, Guatemala and stealing a cellular phone.

Information to the press is that she went over to that town between

Saturday, January 30, and Sunday, January 31. While she was there, she was reportedly cornered by a group of Guatemalan residents of the town in the Central Park area. They say that she stole a cellular phone, and was trying to pry it open with a knife. Fortunately, Guatemalan Police officers observed a commotion in the park, and intervened before their attempt at citizen@ arrest turned into a mob which tried to hurt her.

Zika Virus Likely Already in Belize

BELIZE CITY, Thursday, February 4, 2016:

Kim Bautista, Chief of Operations for the Vector Control Unit in the Ministry of Health, said on "Open Your Eyes" on Thursday morning, February 4, that the Zika Virus "most likely is already in Belize". This belief, says Bautista, is based on the geographical location of detected cases. Bautista says if you look at the countries around us "the virus has been detected in every single one". Therefore, it is almost certain that the disease is within our territory. What is the Vector Control Unit a campaign to fight the virus? Well, its anchored on a stern warning to all Belizeans:

Zika Virus Likely Already in Belize

"Don't Get Bite!!"

The Zika Virus has been around for more than 60 years - but it is only in the past year that scientists and health experts have become seriously worried about it. A massive outbreak that started last year in Brazil brought it sharply into focus because of emerging links to microcephaly - a congenital disorder that can shrink unborn babiesøbrains and heads and reduce life expectancy. Since April, the virus has spread quickly. There have been confirmed cases affecting more than a million people so far. Transmission is currently active in at least 30 countries across the Americas, Pacific islands and Cape Verde, while Zika has also appeared in Australia, Ireland and several other European countries after tourists were infected abroad. There is no known cure or vaccine. The virus was believed to be exclusively spread by mosquitos until authorities in the US

reported a patient had caught it through sexual contact.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) has described it as having potentially "explosive pandemic potential" and the authority has declared a global public health emergency on 1 February. Zika is a mosquito-borne disease that normally has symptoms similar to the dengue and chikungunya viruses, which are spread by the same mosquito, the Aedes Aegypti mosquito. It is named after the Zika Forest near Lake Victoria in Uganda, where it was first noticed in 1947 from a captive monkey. Since, it has spread across Africa to Asia, Pacific Polynesia and now the Americas. Only 14 "sporadic" human cases were detected until 2007.

Zika has now affected almost 30 countries already, mainly in the

Americas. The World Health Organization has said, "Every country in which Aedes mosquitos are present can be at risk for the spread of Zika virus disease."

It is only a matter of time before cases are officially reported in Belize. The Vector Control Unit has already done considerable ground work to limit the spread of the disease, says Bautista. The Ministry of Finance has

provided about \$800,000 to the unit over the past years, in addition to the \$2,000,000 in grants from the Global Fund and the European Union to combat vector borne illnesses. These monies have allowed the unit to replace its formerly dilapidated vehicle fleet, procure equipment and train personnel at both the community and technician level. The Ministry of Finance stands ready to release additional funds to the unit if needed to launch a campaign against the Aedes Aegypti Mosquito.

Foreign Affairs Ministry immediately travelled to Melchor to try and intercede on her behalf to ensure that she is treated fairly by Guatemalan law enforcement. She was supposed to be arraigned on the charge of aggravated robbery on Monday, February 1, but most likely due to logistics, she was transferred to Peten, Guatemala to a state

prison, similar to the Belize Central Prison. She has been held there in detention for two days, and it is expected that today, Thursday, February 4, she will get her day in court. In the meantime, Ambassador Guerra is trying his very best to assist her in any way he can to preserve her rights to a fair trial. If found guilty, she could be facing 6 months in jail.

Ministry of Education Saves Hundreds of Teachers' Jobs

BELMOPAN, Cayo, Wednesday, February 3, 2016:

Teachers of Belize got another break from the Ministry of Education when **Hon. Patrick Faber** signed a Statutory Instrument on Wednesday, February 3, that will save hundreds of them from losing their job because of delinquency.

Teachers have been urged by the Government of Belize to secure their qualifications for Teacher Licenses since the Education Act was passed in 2000. More than 15 years later, hundreds of teachers in our classrooms are still not qualified to teach. This can not be allowed to continue, says the Ministry of Education. As part of its plan to improve quality and relevance under the Education Sector Reform Strategy, the Ministry of Education has set a goal to have one hundred percent trained teachers in the classrooms across Belize. The ministry reinforced its position with the passage of an amendment to the Education Act in 2010 and informed all stakeholders of its intention to enforce requirements for teacher

training and licenses for individuals in the classroom. For teachers who did not have qualifications for a license, a five year provisional license was issued on June 30 2011 for them to remain in the classroom. During this five years they were expected to further their education and take

lessons in pedagogy in order to meet qualifications for a license.

Hundreds of provisional licenses will be up at the end of this school year and even more will expire at the midpoint of the next school year. Many of the teachers have not accomplished the goals that were set out for them when they were granted the provisional licenses. They did not further their education - did not access teacher training. Some of them only just signed up for classes a semester ago because they knew a deadline was coming. If the ministry was to hold on to its position, hundreds of teachers would not be able to teach on September 2016. Fortunately, for them, the Ministry of Education has come up with another special provision for these tail draggers to remain in the system.

On Wednesday, February 3, Hon. Patrick Faber signed a Statutory Instrument that makes provisions for a "Special Permit" to be granted to teachers who have not yet met the qualifications for a teachers license. Teachers that can apply for the Special Permit are those who have completed a minimum of 70 percent of the total credit load for the teacher education program they are currently enrolled in. Teachers who were working in rual areas and whose study leave request were not supported are also eligible to apply since they had limited opportunity to access a teacher education program. Those who teach at the early childhood or lower primary level may apply. Secondary school teachers with Associate degrees in a subject for which there is no locally available teaching certification program are qualified for a Special Permit. Applicants who are currently on approved study leave with an expired provisional license may apply. And, in order to not deny veteran teachers of the benefits from retirement, teachers who are scheduled to retire in or before 2018 are qualified for a Special Permit.

Applicants for Special Permits must submit their forms between February 3 and March 15 to the Special Permit Advisory Committee. The committee will review and evaluate the applications and forward its recommendations to the Chief Education Officer, **Dr**, **Carol Babb**, on March 31. Dr, Babb will make the final decision on who is to receive Special Permits by April 7. The Special Permit Advisory Committee is comprised of Deputy Chief Education Officers, Dr. Neulin Villanueva and Mrs. Cecilia Smith, Director of Teacher Administration Services, Mrs. Luana Sosa, Representative of General Managers of Pre and Primary Schools Association, Mrs. Deborah **Domingo**, President of the National Teachers Union, Luke Palacio, and President of the Belize Association of Secondary School Principals, Ms. Yolanda Gongora.

The Special Permits may be issued for a period of three years. Forms are available at the Ministry of Education of offices countrywide.

Scholarships to New Zealand Now Available BELMOPAN, Cayo, Thursday, Frebruary 4, 2016: New Zealand. The Scholarship is available to those working in the public second class honors level or above

Belizeans who wish to pursue higher education in New Zealand can now apply for scholarships that have been made available. Nominations are invited from suitably qualified applicants wishing to pursue post-graduate programmes in New Zealand commencing in February of 2017. The award is being offered for

two (2) PhD or Masters level study

in New Zealand. The Scholarship is available to those working in the public sector, private sector and civil society organizations.

Applicants must be a citizen of Belize. They must be residing in Belize for at least two (2) years prior to the application submission. It is important that an applicant must be applying to commence a new qualification and not seeking funding for one already commenced. They

must hold a first degree of upper second class honors level or above or at second class degree and a relevant post-graduate qualification. Applicants should be able to take up their awards by the start of the New Zealand academic year in February of 2017.

If you intend to apply you are strongly encouraged to secure admission to the preferred institutions in New Zealand in advance of scholarship application. Acopy of that admission letter or email must be attached to the application form before submission. Whilst awards remain open to all subjects of study, preference will be given to applications that demonstrate linkage to the country of development priorities.

Applicants are encouraged to make such links explicit in their application. Additional information can be obtained from the Ministry of the Public Service, Energy and Public Utilities. Application forms are available at the Ministry and applicants who meet the criteria will be required to attend an interview as part of the selection process. Duly completed applications should be submitted to the Ministry of the **Public Service, Energy and Public** Utilities at Sir Edney Cain Building in Belmopan no later than 4:00 p.m. on Monday, 30th May, 2016.

Belizean Banks in Crisis -Your Credit Card in Trouble

BELIZEZ CITY, Monday, February 1, 2016:

"There is currently not a single bank in Belize with no form of international correspondence," says Prime Minister Dean Barrow, who returned from the United States on Monday, February 1, after a mission to save Belizean banks from financial "Armageddon".

Bank of America announced on April 27, 2015 that it was cancelling its correspondent banking operation with Belize Bank. That was a huge blow for the country and it was followed by other large U.S. banks pulling out of partnerships with Belizean banks. This caused people in the banking sector, trade merchants and other Belizean business owners hours of sleep. The economy of Belize depends on the ability "of our importers and exporters to send money to the States to pay for goods and receive money from the states for their goods," says PM Barrow. If there is no corresponding banks in the United States to complete the transactions then trade with our largest partner will cease. Belizeans will no longer be able to purchase goods online

and relatives abroad will no longer be able to send money back home.

The situation is at this point because banks in the US are terrified of engaging in correspondent relations with financial institutions of this jurisdiction. While the US government says it is discouraging their institutions from ending relations with Belize and other countries in the region, their actions make it irresponsible for any profit based enterprise to continue such practice. The United Statesø Anti-Money Laundering and Combating the Financing of Terrorism (AML/CFT) campaign

could kill the Caribbean banking sector.

U.S. banks could face huge penalties if one tainted transaction slips through. This means they would have to invest heaviliy in monitoring transactions coming from countries like Belize who by itself does not have the monitoring capability to track sources of capital passing through the system. Therefore, a client who seems legitimate in Belize based on their history could have made purchases for or from sources deemed to be taininted by the United States. This would make them a sponsor of terrorism. Belize does not have access to information that would allow them to link the apparently clean client with individuals or organizations labeled by the U.S. as suspected radicals. If Belize process a transaction for this "clean" client through correspondence with U.S. banks and they do not flag the transaction then they could be penalized. Prime Minister Barrow painted it this way: "Why if I can make a million dollars doing business with you I would take the risk of paying a billion dollars in fines if something goes wrong?"

Prime Minister Dean Barrow, Secretary of Finance, Joseph Waight, Governor of the Central Bank, Glen Yssaguirre, and Economic Ambassador, Mark Espat, were joined in the United States by Belizes Ambassador Pat Hughes on a mission to hold meetings with several financial regulatory agencies from January 25 to January 29. The team returned to Belize and Prime Minister Barrow briefed the nation on his strategy to avert a banking crisis.

U.S. banks made a little more than six million dollars in 2014 from corresponent transactions with banks in Belize. That is not even a drip in the bucket for large institutions like Bank of America. It is for this reason that the Government of Belize has decided to target smaller banks for correspondent relations. Prime Minister Barrow said in his briefing on Monday, "We have learnt that it may be better to go after the smaller banks who can handle the load just as well as the top banks." This decision was foreshadowed before the team left on the mission when he said that for small banks "it would rather make more economic sense to do business in Belize since they are not so big as to be able to simply turn up their nose at business in Belize and decide that it's not worth it because of the regularity burden."

Competition For Best Municipal Football Pitch

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, Thursday, February 4, 2016:

Victor August Football Field in Santa Elena and Victor Galvez Recreation Field in San Ignacio will have some stiff competition for the title of Best Municipal Field in Belize. That is because the Isidro Beaton Football Stadium in Belmopan City is more than seventy percent complete and its beauty can no longer be hidden behind construction walls.

The stadium is being renovated to world class standards at a cost of \$3.5 million. However the scope of works has been expanded and the massive beauty that will be the pride of Belmopan may actually end up being the pride of the entire country.

That is if the fields being built in Santa Elena at the Victor August Football Stadium was not ing the race. The Santa Elena Football Complex and Facilities will include a basketball court, training football field, a FIFA standard playing field and a mile long running track. It has an estimated cost of \$2.25 million. It will be the home of Cayo Centraløs very own Premiere League team which Hon. Rene Montero says will be launched this year.

Other facilities in the race are the Victor Galvez Recreation Field in San

Ignacio which is being upgraded to international standards at a cost of more than \$1.3 million. The Benque Viejo Del Carmen Football Complex and Facilities will be upgraded to FIFA standard at an approximate cost of \$4.5 million. Belize will have its first

synthetic turf field in San Pedro Town for the San Pedro Football Field expected to cost in the neighbourhood of \$3.25 million. Multipurpose facilities will be built in Dangriga and Punta Gorda for up to \$5 million each.

These projects are being imple-

mented by the Belize Infrastructure Limited.



have you got?"


"Sand," says Juan.

'Tree Man' Abul Bajandar To Get Government-Funded Surgery

Bangladesh's government will pay for the treatment of "tree man" Abul Bajandar, who has a rare disease that causes warts to form on his body.

Health minister **Mohammad Nasim** made the announcement after visiting Mr Bajandar in hospital on Thursday.

Mr Bajandar has epidermodysplasia verruciformi, a genetic disease that makes a person susceptible to skin growth. It is popularly known as "tree man disease".

He first developed warts 10 years ago.

"Initially, I thought that they're harmless," Mr Bajandar

told AFP.

"There are now dozens of two to three inch roots in both my hands. And there are some small ones in my legs," he said.

Mr Bajandar travelled to India to seek treatment, but his family could not afford the cost of operations.

Samples of his blood and skin tissue are now being sent to a laboratory in the United States, professor **Abul Kalam**, a plastic s urgeon, told the BBC.

He will be treated in Bangladesh when his diagnosis reports are available.

Mr Bajandar's is one of only three cases of "tree man disease" in the world, Samanta Lal Sen, director at Dhaka Medical College Hospital, told AFP.

"It is the first time we have found such a rare case in Bangladesh," he said.

Zika

Symptoms

About 1 in 5 people infected with Zika virus become ill (i.e., develop Zika).

The most common symptoms of Zika are fever, rash, joint pain, or conjunctivitis *(red eyes)*. Other

Virus

common symptoms include muscle pain and headache. The incubation period *(the time from exposure to symptoms)* for Zika virus disease is not known, but is likely to be a few days to a week.

The illness is usually mild with

symptoms lasting for several days to a week.

People usually donot get sick enough to go to the hospital, and they very rarely die of Zika.

Zika virus usually remains in the blood of an infected person for about a week but it can be found longer in some people.

Diagnosis

The symptoms of Zika are similar to those of dengue and chikungunya, diseases spread through the same mosquitoes that transmit Zika.

See your healthcare provider if you develop the symptoms described above and have visited an area where Zika is found.

If you have recently traveled, tell your healthcare provider when and where you traveled.

Your healthcare provider may order specialized blood tests to look for Zika or other similar viruses like dengue or chikungunya.

Treatment

There is no vaccine to prevent or specific medicine to treat Zika infections.

Treat the symptoms:

Get plenty of rest.

Drink fluids to prevent dehydration.

Take medicine such as acetaminophen (Tylenol®) to relieve fever and pain.

Do not take aspirin and other non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs.

If you are taking medicine for another medical condition, talk to your healthcare provider before taking additional medication.

If you have Zika, prevent mosquito bites for the first week of your illness.

During the first week of infection, Zika virus can be found in the blood and passed from an infected person to a mosquito through mosquito bites.

An infected mosquito can then spread the virus to other people.
